



THE THREE TREES CHART

Literal trees in Genesis, which serve as figures.	Old covenant figure	New covenant figure: Calvary's Cross (the tree)	The symbol in Ezekiel and Revelation.
<p>Tree of life</p> 	<p>Positive aspect of the covenant of works. Communion and blessing of God producing fruit of blessing and righteousness, being kept and dressed. Being central in man's world. Eternal life.</p>	<p>Positive aspect of Calvary. The cross of Calvary is a tree of life where Christ offered up a perfect life of righteousness</p>	<p>A symbol of the blessings that flow from Calvary resulting in the fruits of blessing, communion and righteousness.</p>
<p>Tree of the knowledge of good and evil</p> 	<p>Negative aspect of the covenant of works. The possibility of separation and the curse of God if consumed resulting in unrighteousness. Man would then know good in relation to evil by conscience and by experience. Death</p>	<p>Negative aspect of Calvary. The cross of Calvary is a tree of death where Christ was punished as a propitiatory sacrifice to remove the guilt and curse.</p>	<p>The tree is absent from the banks of the river in Ezekiel and the new Jerusalem in Revelation because there is no more curse with the redeemed of God.</p>
